What's New in the UC Berkeley Slavic Collections

June 2007

Finding Russian on-line newspapers that we license just became easier. One can find a complete list on the [About this Subject Collection](#) page under Electronic Journals. The list is in alphabetical order by title and has direct links to each newspaper.

April 2007

The 19th century Russian journal [Viestnik Evropy](#) (*Moskva, 1802-1830*), edited by Nikolai Karamzin. is now available in a fully searchable on-line edition. One can view the original issues in PDF format or read it in a reformatted text. Searching can be done either in transliterated Russian or through the provided Cyrillic keyboard.

January 2007

The library has obtained an almost complete run of the journal *Ruskoi viestnik na god*, (Moskva, 1808-1824) edited by Sergei Glinka. The set is on microfilm and can be found in the Newspaper/Microform Reading Room, Doe Library, rm.40, under the call number MICROFILM 79020.

June 2006

The Library has acquired both the print and the on-line version of the [2002 All-Russian Population Census](#). There is added value in the on-line version. First of all the census appears both in the original Russian and in an English translation. It is fully searchable in English, transliterated Russian, or in Cyrillic through the keyboard that is provided. The many tables and graphs that appear in the text can be copied and imported either into a spreadsheet or into a word processing document.

On the same page as the 2002 Census are also a number of other statistical publications which cover Russia and much of the Former Soviet Union.
