- 3. TDM and journal usage
 - a. A question came up recently as to whether to include TDM usage in our usage stats, or to assign another IP address for users conducting TDM. It was decided to include TDM usage in usage statistics. These may look like an anomaly in reported usage stats, since it appears as a sudden spike in usage
 - b. It is possible to exclude known TDM usage from statistics, but Data Services and Acquisitions has discussed leaving the data as-is
 - c. Questions arose about how to analyze the anomalous usage when reviewing serials; it was suggested that Tim Vollmer and Stacy Reardon might have guidance about assessment stats from their TDM workshop
