# 2. Discussion of LHS draft statement on harmful, offensive, or discredited library materials

a. LHS wanted something to add to the website/LibGuides. The draft was based on research and other libraries' statements.

- i. Can't flag every individual potentially-harmful text, especially electronic journals, so this is intended as a general catch-all statement
- ii. Probably will not be posted on every single course/topic LibGuide. Special Collections LibGuide and main subject guides are good options
- b. Covers two interrelated issues: there might be harmful content in the materials, and the language used to describe the materials in the catalog might be harmful
- c. Possible add: who to contact with questions or concerns
  - i. Don't want to create expectations of quick changes to catalog
  - ii. Could just be the general reference inquiry email
- d. Applicable to EPS? Less human subjects research, different issues. May need minor tweaks
  - i. Ask Susan about the geography side of things
- e. Possibly should be library-wide, not division-specific. Consider sending to LEIC
