Announcements

- Please begin talking about approval profile changes within your division.
 Adjustments will be made in January and July (message forthcoming)
- Head of Metadata Services recruitment will begin soon
- ILL Document Delivery for Elsevier and Other ILL Updates (Patrick Shannon)
 - ILL staff have been focusing on filling requests from our licensed holdings and responding to Elsevier requests. ILL is seeing a 100% increase in Elsevier requests compared to this time last year. They are filling 90% of the requests within 1 business day.
 - ILL is not filling requests from our print collections and has not been designated as a core service.
 - Some ILL staff have been assisting in other library service areas (ETAS checking, digitization, etc.)
 - We cannot lend anything that is available through ETAS.
 - Encourage people to continue submitting ILL requests staff is working to find digitized copies.
 - We have been able to receive older materials that are no longer protected by copyright (and not exceedingly long) in digital format by other institutions.
 - We have expanded our DDA program, which will continue when we return to campus.
- Green Glass Working Group Update (20 min)
 - Group will select a few training videos for librarians to view prior to January training. Selectors should think beyond traditional Green Glass use of deselecting materials and identify other analyses that could be run.
 - Possibly use to identify items that need a change circulation status (i.e. rare books that are in the stacks and accessible to everyone, change to building use only).
 - Compare e vs. print
 - Data will be hosted for 3 years with Green Glass
 - Working group will draft a charge for CSC to approve in December.
- Strategic Collaborative Action Partnership Group (20min)
 - Next steps to be discussed during the December CSC meeting:
 - Think about the way we institute our informal collaborations into a best practice

- We will be gathering interesting data from Green Glass which may reveal places where we could have additional agreements.
- Resend survey to get more responses ask librarians to respond even if they do not have any current agreements and provide examples of what "informal" may look like. Provide more guiding information.
- Work with division heads to send out the survey or talk about the survey at council meetings instead of resending to all selectors.
- Jo Anne will take to CDLG for further input
- Change name of the survey
- Provide survey questions and anonymized responses in the appendix of the report.
- Potentially resend survey in Qualtrics to provide additional layer of anonymity.
- Missing informal agreements that may exist between selectors.
- We also do not have documented agreements with UCLA we may want to re envision a strategic partner with UCLA for shared agreements.
- Visit SLM for Collaboration on Campus
- o SILS transition: will help UC wide collaborations

SCLG Update
